## **POOL RULES**

- Everyone entering the pool must sign in. A wristband, Annual Guest Pass or Guest Pass must be presented at time of entry.
- Guests must be accompanied by a resident.
- Children under the age of 13 must be accompanied by an adult.
- Appropriate pool attire must be worn.
- The Pool Company, lifeguard or Association may limit the number of pool users and/or guests or suspend the use of the pool in the best interest of the community.
- The pool may be closed at any time due to inclement weather for a full or partial day.
- Improper use of pool pass or guest pass will result in revocation of pool privileges.
- No one is permitted in the pool or on the pool deck without a lifeguard on duty.
- Running, pushing, ball throwing, wrestling and horseplay of any kind are restricted in the pool and pool area.
- Floatation devices are permitted for children while supervised by a parent or guardian.
- Appropriate pool toys are allowed as long as they do not interfere with other patrons in the pool.
- Abusive or vulgar language, violent or offensive behavior will result in loss of pool privileges for the season.
- Music is permitted as long as it is held at a reasonable level.
- No skateboards, bicycles, roller blades or similar devices are permitted in pool area.
- Items not permitted in pool area:
  - 1. Alcoholic beverages
  - 2. Smoking
  - 3. Drugs
  - 4. Cooking of any kind
  - 5. Glass
  - 6. Pets
- Private parties are not permitted at the pool.
- Diapers are not permitted in the pool.
- All trash must be placed in trash receptacle.
- Any injury or hazard must be reported to the lifeguard immediately.
- Association is not responsible for loss or damage of personal property.
- Pool privileges will be revoked due to outstanding balance.
- Either owners or tenants are permitted to use the pool. Both may not share in the amenity.
- Owners are responsible for their guests and tenant(s). Failure to comply with all of the pool rules will result in loss of pool privileges.
- Private swim lessons are not permitted due to insurance restrictions.
